Join us for our annual meeting on January 24, 2024 at Sawgrass Golf Club. Our guest speaker will be Retired Rear Admiral William Mcquilkin



William McQuilkin is a retired U.S. naval officer and a former Director of the U.S. Navy's Strategy and Policy Division (OPNAV N51) from 2013-2016 where he led the drafting and publishing of "A Cooperative Strategy for 21st Century Seapower", the fundamental roadmap for the U.S. Navy's future. He was the Commander, U.S. Naval Forces Korea from 2011-2013, where he was tasked with deterring aggression from North Korea and improving combined maritime warfighting readiness in the Korean theater. He has commanded three U.S. Navy warships with multiple overseas

deployments including command of the Aegis cruiser USS GETTYSBURG where he served as Air Defense Commander in the Persian Gulf in support of Operations Iraqi Freedom and Enduring Freedom. He has served as Deputy Director of Operations in the National Military Command Center inside the Pentagon where he was an advisor to the Chairman of the Joint Chiefs of Staff and first responder to worldwide events. While on active duty, Rear Admiral (Ret) McQuilkin considered it a top priority to improve military-to-military relations with Indo-Asia-Pacific countries. He worked extensively on security and policy issues pertaining to the Indo-Asia-Pacific and continues to write and speak on these matters. He has participated in talks and lectures with India, Indonesia, Thailand, United Kingdom, South Korea, Sri Lanka, France and Australia.





Have you been longing for a good juicy read without violence, drug addiction or deaths? I was. Pick up TOM LAKE, the most recent novel by Ann Patchett. She is renowned for her characterizations of families you want to know about, including more COMMONWEALTH, her autobiographical most book.

Some critics called TOM LAKE her pandemic novel, because it takes place during the pandemic, and is the cause of three grown daughters returning to their parents' cherry orchard on the peninsula in Michigan. But that is just where the story begins. Emily, Maisie and Nell are fascinated by the fact that their mother, Lara, had an affair with Peter Duke, who went onto become a famous movie star.

The girls want to hear all about the time Lara spent as the star of OUR TOWN at the Tom Lake Playhouse in summer stock with Peter Duke. It's a story within a story within a story, including a movie Lara also starred in and her time in Hollywood.

As an added bonus, if you like Audible, is listening to Meryl Streep read the book in her luscious voice. Enjoy.

Another popular sport in Florida is horseback riding. The book Horseback Riding: A Step-by-Step Guide to Mastering Your Skills by Caroline Stamps, shows



you how to get ready with the appropriate clothing and equipment, then instructions on posture and the horses' gaits. It is full of color photos and a large glossary.



Some people might think karate is a dangerous sport, but Bill Gutman, the author of **Karate** thinks otherwise. He says karate is a sport as well as a science, since it is a means of self-defense and exercise. This book gives you the history,

ways to get started, and posture and movements.

As I reflect on this past year, I'm amazed at fast it went by. Coming to the close of our fiscal year has given me the opportunity to see how far we've come since I began service here last November. Since that time, we have welcomed over 155,000 guests. Our staffing levels have shifted like the tides, and we are so excited to increase our team by 2 additional people in the new year and to add additional service hours before Spring. In addition to presenting programming for all ages (322 events in FY23), phenomenal print and media collections and access to electronic books, news and audiobooks, we offer notary service, wireless connectivity, meeting room use and free document scanning.

In the past year, we've answered nearly 45,000 questions and provided computer access to 15,779 individuals (youth, teen and adult). Countless others have used our free wi-fi, for work or personal tasks. Our meeting rooms were used by community guests for non-library purposes 486 times. We are proud to serve this community in so many ways.

Speaking of service, volunteers for the Library and the Friends of the Library contributed 10,586 hours of service over the past year. We appreciate the support of this remarkable community. Throughout the year, the generous contributions of our Friends made so much of what we do possible. What a year it has been. I can hardly wait to see what's next! We wish you a safe and joyful holiday season.
