Jacksonville Beach Mayor to speak at Ponte Vedra Beach Library

Few people are as knowledgeable of our Beach community—past and present—as Chris Hoffman. The very busy Ms. Hoffman wears two hats as the mayor of Jacksonville Beach and as Executive Director of the Beaches Museum. She will speak at the Ponte Vedra Beach Branch Library on Tuesday, June 4 as part of the Friends of the Library Speaker Series. Her talk centers on "Our Beaches: Past, Present and Future."

Chris Hoffman is the first woman to serve as mayor of Jacksonville Beach. She graduated from Fletcher High School, received her bachelor's degree from the University of Florida and her MBA from the University of North Florida. She had previously served as a two-term city councilwoman.

The Beaches Museum's mission is to preserve and share the distinct history and culture of the Beaches area. As Executive Director, Chris oversees the day-to-day operations and the programs and events that have grown to include Springing the Blooms, Pablo Beach Train Day, the Chapel Concert Series, monthly Boardwalk Talks, and exhibits spotlighting the Beach life.

The June 4 program begins at 6:30 p.m. in the library's FOL Community Room. Doors will open at 6 p.m.

BOOK REVIEWS

Chinese - American Relationships

A display in the Children's Room recently made me curious. It was a series of books looking almost identical, at least on the outside. The author is Andrea Cheng who was a prolific author during her too short life. She left a variety of picture books, young adult novels, middle-grade fiction and non-fiction.

Ms. Cheng was born in Texas and raised by Hungarian immigrant parents. She married Jim Cheng and had three children, but died of cancer at age 58. Her active years as a writer was between 1991 and 2015.

The series of five books tells the story of Anna Wong and her trials and disappointments growing up with Chinese parents in America, but not knowing anything about their country or the language. In *The Year of the Book* Anna is in fourth grade, and everything in her life

is about relationships to her parents and friends, especially her best friend. In *The Year of the Baby*, Anna is excited to have a new sister Kaylee, who was adopted from China. The baby's refusal to eat is solved when Anna discovers that she likes to hear singing while eating.

The next book is *The Year of the Fortune Cookie* where Anna is now in sixth grade. Anna is on her way to China with the Sylvester family and gifts of home-made fortune cookies and knitted hats for an orphanage. She will visit the orphanage her sister came from to find out more about the baby's background and do lots of sightseeing in Bejing. A young girl who works in the hotel, Fan, wants to visit America and Anna promises she will one day. They spend time together and Anna learns about China.

In the book *The Year of the Garden*, Anna's family moves to a new house and Anna meets a new friend Laura. Together they make

a garden, find a bunny to take care of while developing a great friendship.

The fifth book in this series is *The Year of Three Sisters*. Anna is now twelve years old and wants to invite her friend Fan from Bejing to come as an exchange student. The ticket is paid for by friends of Anna's parents. Fan comes but is not placed in Anna's class, she is homesick and studies constantly not participating in her friends' activities. After a call to her mother in China, Fan decides to stay a while longer and becomes more sociable.

The books are fast reading and portray a warm and typical girl all children can identify with despite her ethnic stereotyping issues. Andrea Cheng's stories were mostly influenced by her personal experiences and family life. Her first book, *Grandfather Counts*,

@2000, is about a Chinese-American girl who must give up her room when her grandfather comes from China to live with the family, but gains a lot in knowing him.

An editor at Houghton Mifflin Publishers said: "Thank you, Andrea Cheng, for giving Asian-American children a series they can see themselves in." Altogether the author published twenty-six books, but most of them are only available through inter-library loans for Ponte Vedra Beach readers.



Two recently published books are about women in Vietnam during the war. *THE WOMEN* by Kristin Hannah is a lengthy page turner about Frances (Frankie) McGrath a debutante from San Diego, who volunteers as a nurse after her Air Force pilot brother dies in his plane over Vietnam.


Frankie works in hospitals where the injured are brought in to the whirring sound of helicopters, and finds solace with the other two nurses




The second book is *ABSOLUTION*, by Alic McDermott, a more literary story about two women who meet in Saigon when their husbands work for the US government. Patricia Kelly is a young (23) newlywed who meets Charlene a† a garden party and is taken under her wing for a series of charity adventures. One leads to a leper colony outside Saigon, where their car breaks down as they attempt to leave. Patricia is finding her way in this society and allows Charlene to lead her. McDermott creates the heat, humidity, variety of languages and tension †ha† pervades this swirl of diplomatic parties.

Now there is a bronze memorial in Washington, DC, to recognize the thousands of women who served there.

SSYRA 2024-2025

We are so grateful for the support our Friends of the Ponte Vedra Beach Branch Library have consistently given us. Each year you provide funds for us to purchase extra copies of the SSYRA titles. These books are selected by a committee of the Florida Association for Media in Education (FAME). The committee selects 15 titles for each list from among hundreds that they read and vet. Through the schools, each child is encouraged to read three titles and then they are eligible to vote for their favorite. In addition, St Johns County School District holds a Battle of the Books where schools select teams to compete in a trivia contest based upon the books. With so many of our local students wanting to

read these titles, the public library provides extra copies so more students have the opportunity.

This year, the FOL has again provided funds so our branch could have even more of these titles. The new titles were announced on April 8, 2024 and we were able to submit an order that day. We purchased an additional two of each title for the three SSYRA lists (Junior, 3-5, and 6-8) as well as one additional title for the TEEN Reads titles. We also were able to purchase any sequels to the titles.

Again, we cannot express how grateful we are that our FOL supports our library and our student/ young patrons in encouraging them to read.


