FOL SPEAKER SERIES RETURNS

The popular FOL Speaker Series returns to the Ponte Vedra Beach Branch Library this fall with two more outstanding speakers. On Tuesday, September 17, Nat Glover, elected as Florida's first Black sheriff since Reconstruction, will discuss his memoir, *Striving for Justice: A Black Sheriff in the Deep South*.

Glover joined Jacksonville's police department in 1966. He was named Police Officer of the Year four times, was promoted to detective, rose to sergeant, and was appointed the city's first hostage negotiator. In 1995, Duval County voters elected him sheriff. He went on to be a mayoral candidate in 2003 and later served as the 29th President of his alma mater, Edward Waters University.

Striving for Justice will be available for sale, and proceeds will help fund scholarships for need-based students through the "Where They Will Shine Scholarship Fund."

Children's Book Review/Fall

With over 400 books published at the age of 8, Jane Yolen has been called the Hans Christian Anderson of America and the Aesop of the 20th century.

Ms. Yolen's output of picture books are over 100. Her series" How do Dinosaurs..." has 23 books with the latest, **How Do Dinosaurs Learn to be Kind?** Mark Teague, illustrator, @2023, ages 3-5. With a question posed in rhyme of each page with large illustrations, the reader knows what the answer is in the end. There are illustrations of dinosaurs and their names.



A Kite for Moon, illustrated by Matt Phelan, @2019, ages 3-5. A little boy who likes to fly kites on the beach notices how sad the moon looks. He sends his kites up with the messages that he will one day join the moon. When he grows up, he becomes an astronaut. This book is dedicated to Neil Armstrong, the first man on the moon.

What to Do with a Box, What to DO with a String, illustrated by C.F.Payne, @2019, ages 4-8, shows a littles girl catching a rhino, making phone lines, and making a "glorious swing with a string."

Baby Bear's Books, illustrated by Melissa Sweet, @2006, ages 2-5. This book has full page color illustrations with rhyming tales of Baby Bear's love for books any time of the day. "Snack time's the right time for hearing a tale. A story, like honey, can never be stale." Isn't that the truth!
